The story is narrated for us by a Minstrel (James Borgmann). Watch the royal court as they test princess candidate #12 {Sharon Nichols}; see Prince Dauntless (Rickie Toland) pine for a bride while his mother, Queen Aggravain (Mish Serries), keeps rejecting princess candidates. Since no one in the kingdom can get married until Prince Dauntless does, the stakes are high when a new, swampy-looking princess, Winnifred (Debbie Kruep), comes to court to apply for the bride ship. Session 1 Workshop – Thursday, March 5, 2026, 4-6 pm, at Fairway Recreation Center AZ 4

This session will include choosing a monologue, studying the context and backstory, and identifying the story arc. Be advised that Ann will have plenty of monologues from which to choose or you can bring your own. They will not need to be **memorized** and should be no more than 5 minutes long.

Session 2 Workshop – Tuesday, March 10, 2026, 4-6 pm, at Lakeview Rec Center SH 2

This session will include staging, blocking, and leveling (variation in volume, pace and intensity).

Readers Theater Ensemble

Class sessions continue the first and third Saturday of each month from 10 am-noon at Fairway Recreation Center. Next session will take place on Saturday, February 7, 2026. We will be rehearsing ***How to Be Happy...Though Married***, which we will present at the February 16 Monday Night Gathering at Mountain View Recreation Center. This production explores marriage, not as a fairy tale, but as a lived experience. This is not a how-to manual or a cautionary tale. It is an honest, wry, and deeply human recognition piece. Whether married, once married, happily partnered or thoughtfully single, audiences will recognize some of these experiences in themselves.

February 11, 2026 – Let's Improv

Improv isn't about being funny. It's about showing up and saying "Yes". In this workshop, you will sharpen your creativity, communication, and connection through playful, low-pressure games.

February 18, 2026 – Discover Character

Great characters don't happen by accident. In this workshop, you'll develop distinct characters through backstory, physicality, and psychology. Walk away with tools you can use onstage in your next role.

Helene has dozens of plays to her credit and has received many AriZoni nominations. In addition to theater, she has worked in radio and television in both New York and Boston. Shelley Logan will be the guest speaker at this workshop in which she will present breath and voice exercises to improve enunciation and projection. Update on Performing Arts Center

NEW PAC PROGRESS

First, thanks to the many Players members who heeded the call and attended the update meeting Tuesday night, Jan 13, 2026, at Sundial regarding the plans for the Mountain View campus. Our “showing up” made a very strong impression on the RCSC Board members and on all who attended.

There were two purposes for this meeting. First, the architects, Tri-arc, wanted to propose three alternative plans for the Mountain View overall renovations (SS photo).

Option 3 includes most of what has been requested by the community. Option 3A is the “barebones” alternative, and revises or eliminates several items. Option 3B represents a compromise of sorts, a middle ground between 3 and 3A, and the bottom-line cost is closest to the actual PIF budget for Mountain View. 3B and 3A represent reductions in size for the PAC

Players leadership wants Option 3 but recognizes we might have to settle for Option 3B. Option 3A is by far the least favorable option.

The second purpose of the meeting was to move towards a decision on fixed vs movable seating for the PAC. From the discussion it was very clear that the best alternative is fixed seating, in terms of cost, flexibility, and usefulness by your senior population. And the RCSC board seemed to agree

When asked about the timeline, the board seemed comfortable with and is still hoping that groundbreaking would be by the end of 2026.

I encourage all our members to find opportunities to communicate with the board members and express your wishes for the best possible PAC money can buy.
